Subscription Fees

For the third year running we have been able to keep our monthly subscription the same price. Your help is needed in reducing the admin burden our volunteers face, though. As at the 3rd September, 18 August payments are still outstanding. A further 66 payment also failed on the 1st September 2025.

1. Monthly subscription fees should be paid via a Class for Kids subscription (our preferred method of payment) or standing order on the 1st of the month.
2. If you are notified of a problem with payment being taken using Class For Kids, we kindly request for you to check your C4K account and ensure all details are accurate and up to date before it makes a final attempt to take the payment on the 9th.
3. With prior agreement from the chairman / treasurer a standing order may be set up for an alternative day in the month.
4. If a payment is not made by the 28th of the month a suspension will be issued. The player will be suspended from all training, matches and tournaments until the outstanding fees are paid.
5. If payment is not made on the 1st / agreed payment date for 3 consecutive months the player will be removed from the club

The administration and time spent chasing outstanding subscription fees each month is unfortunately increasing, please be mindful that all our committee members and coaches are volunteers and the time spent chasing outstanding fees could be being put to much better use for the benefit of the club.

Welfare update

As we continue to grow, we have expanded our welfare team. You may have noticed that a Club Welfare Officer is now in your teams WhatsApp groups. This is on the guidance of the FA.

Our Welfare Officers ensure a fun and safe environment by safeguarding children in football, implementing safeguarding procedures, and managing criminal record checks (DBS) for those working with young people. Deb and her team serve as a vital link between the club, the County FA, and the FA, acting as a primary contact for safeguarding concerns and promoting best practices for behaviour and safety on and off the field.

Players Code of Conduct

By choosing to play for Crewe Town FC you agree to abide by the following.

- I will be positive by playing my best, being my best and helping to make sure I and everyone else enjoys playing football.
- Support the club's code of conduct by always playing my best for the team, play fairly and friendly, show respect to my coaches, parents, club, team mates and referees.
- Be gracious in victory and defeat.
- Never engage in, support or use foul language & abusive behaviour.
- Listen to my coaches, understanding that they do what is best for the tea
- Talk to someone I trust or the Club Welfare Officer if I am unhappy about anything.
- Encourage my team mates.
- Respect the facilities both home and away.
- Uphold the rules of the game.
- Represent the club in a positive and respectful manner.

I understand if I do not follow the code of conduct I may be.

- Asked to apologise to those affected by my actions.
- Receive a formal warning from my coaches.
- Receive a written warning from the Club Committee outlining the issues and implications going forward.
- Be dropped, substituted or suspended from training or asked to leave the club indefinitely.

Parents & Spectators Code of Conduct

When coming to spectate at Crewe Town FC you agree to abide by the following:

Set the standard.

- If we behave positively during training and matches, our children will too.
- By setting a good example we help build a supportive environment where everyone can enjoy themselves.

Play your part and support the club code of conduct.

- Have fun, it's what we are here for.
- Celebrate effort and good play from both sides.
- Always respect the referee, coaches and volunteers whilst encouraging players to do the same.
- Stay within the designated spectators area at games and training.
- When players make mistakes give encouragement.
- Never engage in, support or tolerate offensive, insulting or abusive language/behaviour. Negative comments or comments inciting aggression and/or foul play do not belong in football.
- Adhere to venue rules and regulations, both home and away.
- Finally, always conduct yourselves in a respectable manner.

I understand if I do not follow the code of conduct.

Our volunteers may issue a warning and I may be asked to leave the venue, required to meet with Club, League or County FA Welfare Officer, maybe obliged to sit an FA education course, may be suspended from games, training and events, may be required to leave the club along with dependants and/or issued with a fine by the League or County FA.

Managers, Committee & Volunteers

Code of Conduct

By volunteering for Crewe Town FC you agree to abide by the following:

Be the standard.

- By choosing to volunteer for CTFC you agree to ensuring your conduct during training, matches and club events is maintained at a high standard. Remembering, you are representing the club.

Support the club code of conduct.

- Respect the referees decisions, even if you do not agree with them.
- Agree to never use or engage in foul language & abusive behaviour.
- Be responsible and accountable for the conduct of players and spectators in accordance with respective league guidelines.
- Complaints regarding the conduct of other teams players, managers, coaches and spectators must be made through the Club Welfare Officer who will escalate on your behalf.
- Any issues regarding the opposition players are to be discussed with the opposition manager, you are not to approach an opposition player directly.
- If you are coaching children's football remember, you are there to set the right example.
- In accordance with FA rules you are not to enter the playing area without the express permission of the referee.

I understand if I do not follow the code of conduct.

I may be issued with a warning or be asked to leave, may be required to meet with the Club, League or County FA Welfare Officer, may be obliged to attend an FA education course, may be suspended from matches, training or events, maybe issued with a fine by the League or County FA, may be required to leave the club indefinitely.
